January 2015 - Chip (Tig) had 6 homes and was in danger of not being able to be rehomed because of his unpredictable behaviour. He was still a puppy and both Helen (CTRF Trustee) and Yvonne who kennelled him, thought he deserved another chance.

He was on his last warning, we needed a special person, who was experienced in dog behavior and who understood Cairns to take him on. We found that person, who agreed to foster him. Read his story. He has now been adopted by his foster Mum.
